

The unofficial election results will be certified by the?<u>Washington Conservation Commission</u>?at its May 21, 2009 business meeting. Once certified, Drew will be eligible to sit at the King CD board of supervisors meeting on June 8, 2009.

The final vote tallies for elected board position #3 included Preston Drew (1,357 votes); David Mauk of Carnation (175 votes); and write-in candidate Mark Sollitto of?Seattle?(1,199 votes).

The total voter turnout marked more than doubled the highest turnout numbers in the last five years of King CD elections, according the Executive Director Jeffrey Possinger.

?These elections have been held since 1949 and the?unprecedented turn-out this year is a reflection of the increased number of voting centers as well as the higher profile we have taken in recent years because of our voluntary conservation and stewardship efforts with private landowners,? said Possinger.

King CD, working with Bellevue-based election administrator Election Trust, provided 13 polling locations across the district (which includes most of?King?County). The election is held in accordance with Washington Revised Code RCW 89.08.

The all-volunteer, five-member board includes three elected members and two who are appointed by the Washington State Conservation Commission. All supervisors serve three-year terms. As public officials, their responsibility is to ensure that the King CD meets its legal and public trust obligations. The board of supervisors conducts regular public meetings to oversee the district?s budget and provide guidance and oversight to district staff.

Supervisors are expected to help identify critical resource conservation needs in their district, communicate with the public and seek feedback about conservation programs from district residents.

The King CD provides information and technical assistance programs that are available to all landowners within the district?s boundaries on a voluntary, non-regulatory basis. Its hands-on, site specific, action and results oriented; and it initiates community outreach activities that include workshops, education programs, site visits, farm plans, and consultation on land, water, and wildlife management.

As one of 47 conservation districts in the state, the King CD is a natural resources assistance agency authorized by the State of?Washington?and guided by the Washington State Conservation Commission. For more information on the King Conservation District, visit?<u>www.kingcd.org</u>
